How do I apply?	Applications for the Short Courses and Emerging Leaders Program are online. Information about the courses and to apply online, please visit our website: https://Inkd.in/exiUvBgq
Can I submit my application via email?	No. All applications will need to be submitted online by the closing date. Please visit https://lnkd.in/exiUvBgq
Will there be information sessions to learn more about the programs?	Yes! Virtual information sessions will be held for each Short Course and Emerging Leaders Program. You can find more information on the virtual information sessions on the factsheets on our website: https://lnkd.in/exiUvBgq
What are the minimum education requirements?	Applicants at minimum must hold a bachelor's degree or equivalent and provide a certified copy of your degree as part of your online application.
How many years' work experience should I have to apply for the Programs?	For our Short Courses and Emerging Leaders Programs we are targeting early-to-mid career professionals with between five-and ten-years' work experience related to the course you are applying for.
I am not currently working, am I still able to apply?	Yes! In the application form when promoted to insert current employment you are enter 'NA or not currently working'. You are able to use your most recent supervisor to complete the reference form.
What English level do I need?	We recommend applicants have professional working proficiency in English (recommended of at least IELTS level (or equivalent exam) of 6.5.
	If you have completed an English exam, you can upload as part of your application.
	As part of the application form you will also be asked whether your bachelor's degree was completed in English and whether you use English regularly in your job.
Do I need to cover the costs of travel and accommodation for the in-Australia component?	No. Participants will receive a return airfare, accommodation, transport and meals for the in-Australia component.

Can I apply for more than one Program?	As the courses are targeting very different technical areas, you should apply for the course that aligns with your work experience.
Are male applicants able to apply for the ASEAN's Digital Transformation: Balancing Innovation, Integrity and Inclusion Short Course?	The ASEAN Digital Transformation: Balancing Innovation, Integrity and Inclusion Short Course is targeting female applicants. What is the schedule of the course?	The course will include a one week in-Australia component, participants will be expected to attend the full program which could include day and evening activities during weekdays and weekends. Participants will need to ensure they are not working or have other commitments that will prevent participation. The virtual component schedule will be dependent on the
	course provider and participant preferences. This may include sessions during work hours or outside work hours.
I am not currently residing in my home country, can I still apply?	All prospective applicants must adhere to the following eligibility requirements: Must be a citizen of and residing in Australia, Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar *, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam or Timor - Leste (*Residency requirement does not apply to Myanmar citizens.
